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Games with Prizes

Right/Left Games:

You can have several inexpensive (dollar store-type) gifts wrapped to pass around.

I've also been to parties where they have used "white elephant" gifts. Everyone sits in a circle holding a gift. Someone reads the story below, reading slowly enough for gifts to be passed. Every time the word RIGHT is read, everybody passes his gift to the right. Every time the word LEFT is read, everybody passes the gift he's holding to the left. The gift each person is holding when the story ends is the gift he or she keeps.

Christmas With the RIGHT Family

Christmas was almost here, and mother RIGHT was finishing the Christmas baking. Father RIGHT, Susan RIGHT, and Billy RIGHT returned from their last-minute Christmas errands. "There's not much LEFT to be done," said father RIGHT as he came into the kitchen. "Did you leave the basket of food at the church?" asked mother RIGHT. "I LEFT it RIGHT where you told me to," said father RIGHT.

"I'm glad my shopping is done", said Billy RIGHT. "I don't have any money LEFT." The hall telephone rang and Susan RIGHT LEFT to answer it. She rushed back to and told the family, "Aunt Tillie RIGHT LEFT a package for us RIGHT on grandma RIGHT's porch. I'll go over there RIGHT now and get it", she said as she LEFT in a rush. Father RIGHT LEFT the kitchen and brought in the Christmas tree.

By the time Susan RIGHT returned, mother RIGHT, father RIGHT, and Billy RIGHT had begun trimming the tree. The entire RIGHT family sang carols as they finished the decorating. Then they LEFT all the presents under the tree and went to bed, hoping they had selected the RIGHT gifts for their family.

People Finder Game

As guests arrive, you hand them the list of descriptions and tell her she must try to find someone who fits each description and write their name in the blank beside. The catch is: you can't use the same name more than two times. Whoever gets all (or the most) filled in first is the winner. Then you can share the names with the whole group and ask specific questions if desired.

- 2.*owns a pair of red shoes, but is not wearing them now
- 3.*likes to watch old, "classic" movies (what is favorite?)
- 4.*when giving directions, uses words like "north" or "east"
- 5.*has lived in a very small town (& where was it?)

- 8.*likes to make things (carpentry or crafty)
- 9.*never had a cavity
- 10.*went "nowhere" for this last "summer vacation"
- 11.*showers in the evening rather than the morning

- 13.*is planning on having at least one more child
- 14.*has an annual pass to sea world or Disney
- 15.*has a story about "why their driver's license picture looks like that"

Drawing Games:

Draw a Heart

Have guests hold a piece of paper on their heads and draw a heart. After doing this, have them draw legs, arms, eyes, ears, nose, mouth, hair, etc. Award points for the ones that are closest to looking like a person in the shape of a heart.

Blind Hawaii

Let's Travel To A Hawaiian Island

Give everyone a piece of paper, and tell your guests to close their eyes and imagine that you are on a Hawaiian Island.

1. First, draw an island in the middle of your paper.
2. Then to the left of your island, draw a ship.
3. Your island is surrounded by water, so please put some fish in the sea.
4. This is Hawaii, so put a palm tree on the island.
5. Its a nice day, so put some birds in the air.
6. That ship didn't get there by itself, so put a sailor in the ship.
7. He might get hungary, so draw some coconuts on the palm tree.
8. Sailors like to see where they are going, so put some portholes on the ship.
9. Sailors like entertainment, so draw a hula dancer on the island.
10. Its a sunny day, so put the sun in the sky.

Now open your eyes and how does it look.

Now if your island is in the middle, give yourself ten points.

If your ship is to the left of the island, but not touching, give yourself ten points.

If you have more than two fish, give yourself fifteen points.

If the base of the palm tree is on the island, give yourself twenty points.

If you have more than two birds in the air, give yourself twenty points.

If your sailor is on the ship, not swimming, give yourself twenty points.

If there are any coconuts on the tree, give yourself fifteen points.

If your portholes are on the ship, give yourself twenty points.

If your hula dancer is on the island and not touching water, give yourself twenty points.

Now if the sun is....

To the left, give yourself twenty points.

If it is to the right, give yourself fifteen points.

And if your sun is in the middle, give yourself ten points.

Now add your points up and the guest with the highest score will win a special prize. A perfect score is 165.

Easter Drawing Game

This is a cute game to play at your parties right before Easter!

Give each guest a piece of paper. Make sure everyone has a writing utensil and something hard underneath the paper (i.e. catalog, table, etc.). Tell your guests to shut their eyes and they will have to keep them closed until they are instructed to open them.

Have them draw a circle for their bunny's head and another one for his body. Then draw two legs and feet on the bunny. Now have them give their bunnies two arms and hands. Put a face on the bunny being sure not to forget the whiskers). Next, draw an Easter basket on the ground next to the bunny. Put a carrot in your bunny's left hand. Next, put Easter eggs in the basket. Say, "Oops! We forgot his cottontail." Instruct them to add a tail on the bunny. Now,

write Happy Easter at the top of the page.

Let guests open their eyes to look at their drawing. Have them score the drawing as follows:

5 points if face is in the circle for the head

5 points if head and body touch

10 points if tail touches bunny at all

25 points if the eggs are decorated

20 points if at least two eggs made it in the basket

10 points if at least one egg is in the basket

5 points if the carrot touches the bunny at all

5 points if the basket is on the ground next to the bunny

10 points if the "Happy Easter" is legible

Give the guest with the most points a small prize. You may also want to give a prize for the funniest drawing

"HAPPY EASTER" BUNNY

Tell them to draw a circle for their bunny's head and another for his body.

Then draw two legs & feet on your bunny.

Now give your bunny two arms and hands.

Put a face on your bunny (don't forget the whiskers)

Draw an Easter basket on the ground next to your bunny.

Put a carrot in your bunny's left hand.

Now go and put Easter eggs in your basket.

Ooops forgot his cottontail ~ go put a tail on your bunny.

Write Happy Easter at top of page.

Score 2 pts if face is in circle for head

5 pts if head and body touch

10 pts if tail touches bunny at all

25 pts you decorated the eggs

20 pts if at least two eggs made it into basket

50 pts if carrot is in bunny's left hand

3 pts if carrot touches bunny at all

6 pts if basket is on ground next to bunny

5 pts if Happy Easter is legible

HALLOWEEN DRAWING GAME *obviously good for Halloween time*

Draw a pumpkin in the center of your page

Put some bats above the pumpkin

Draw a moon on the upper left corner

Ooops! Please put eyes on your pumpkin

Put a spider web in the lower right corner

Did I ask you to put a stem on your pumpkin? Do that now please

Draw some bones below your pumpkin

Draw a ghost on your paper

Please draw a witch's broom on the left of your pumpkin

Oh yes. .and please put a spider in that web

Give points or dollars for as follows:

If your pumpkin is in the middle of the page

\$100 for every bat

If the moon is in the left corner
If there is a nose on the pumpkin
If there are eyes on the pumpkin
If the web is in the lower right corner
If the stem is on top of the pumpkin
\$100 for each bone
If the broom is to the left of the pumpkin
If the spider is in the web

Santa Claus Is Coming To Town-Points

Instructions: Give each guest a sheet of paper and have the guests follow instructions. Tell the guests they must draw the following items with their eyes closed. Please no peeking!

Draw a circle (the body).

Draw a smaller circle (the head).

Draw his left leg.

Now draw his right arm.

Draw his nose on the head.

Draw his boot on his left leg.

Now draw his right leg.

He needs to see, so draw his eyes.

Now draw a sack beside Santa.

Now draw his beard.

Draw his boot on his right leg, then draw his left arm.

Now draw some presents in the sack.

Its very cold outside, Santa needs his gloves on his hands and a hat on his head.

(When reading these directions, just don't read it. Say things like "Santa's left foot is cold--give him a boot or Santa needs a present to give--put one in his sack, etc. Just have fun!)

Points:

10 points if Santa's legs are in the right place.

15 points if Santa's nose is on his head.

20 points if Santa's boots are on his legs.

25 points if you put eyes on the head.

30 points for Santa's sack.

35 points if Santa's gloves are on his hands.

40 points if the presents are in his sack.

40 points for both arms attached.

50 points if Santa's beard is on his face.

75 points if Santa's hat is in its proper place.

Now total the points and award a gift to the guest with the highest score. For scoring, you can even have them give their paper to the person next to them (that way there is no arguing about points).

Variation

Points:

10 points if Santa's legs are in the right place.

15 points if Santa's nose is on his head.

20 points if Santa's boots are on his legs.

25 points if you put eyes on the head.

30 points for Santa's sack.

35 points if Santa's gloves are on his hands.

40 points if the presents are in his sack.

40 points for both arms attached.

50 points if Santa's beard is on his face.

75 points if Santa's hat is in its proper place.

Now total the points and award a gift to the guest with the highest score. For scoring, you can even have them give their paper to the person next to them (that way there is no arguing about points).

Spring Game

RULES: NO Peeking, and NO Questions

Have each person close their eyes and instruct them to draw the following:

In the center, toward the bottom of the paper, draw a Bird Bath.

To the left of the Bird Bath, draw a Tree.

Oh, so sorry, how can we have a Bird Bath without a Bird?! Go back and draw the Bird.

To the upper right side of your paper, draw the Sun.

Of course, we need Flowers under the Bird Bath, so go back and draw them.

Since this is a Spring scene, we must have Butterflies in the sky. Please draw Butterflies.

Oh dear, I almost forgot. We don't have Apples on the tree. Please go back and draw Apples on the tree.

OPEN YOUR EYES!!!!

Tell each guest to keep track of their points and the one with the most will win!

1 point if the Tree is to the left of the Bird Bath and not overlapping anywhere.

2 points if the Tree is big and fluffy.

1 point if the Tree is a Charlie Brown Tree.

2 points if your Flowers are under the Bird Bath.

3 extra points if you gave your Flowers leaves.

1 point if your Sun is not overlapping anything.

3 points if your Sun has rays.

5 points if ALL of your Apples are on the tree.

2 points if some Apples are on and some are off.

5 points if your Bird is actually in your Bird Bath.

As for the Butterflies:

1 point for every Butterfly

5 points if you decorated your Butterfly's

Now add up your points and we'll see who won!!!

Snowman Drawing

This is obviously a winter game, but can be adapted for any season.

1. Close your eyes - and no peaking!
2. Draw the head of a snowman
3. Now draw the middle circle
4. Now draw the bottom circle
5. Give your snowman 2 eyes
6. He needs a nose
7. Now give him 2 arms
8. And 5 buttons marching down his front
9. Oh - he has to have a mouth
10. And you'd better give him a hat before he melts

(To make it even more interesting, you could have everyone draw this with the paper on top of their heads)

- If the head and middle section are touching or overlapping - 5 pts
- If the middle and bottom section are touching or overlapping - 5 pts
- 5 pts for each eye inside his head
- 5 pts if his nose is inside his head
- 5 pts if his mouth is inside his head
- 5 pts for each button that's in the middle or bottom section
- if his arms are connected to his body, 5 pts for each one
- 5 pts if his hat is touching his head

You drew a snowman without using your eyes

Points Games

Give Yourself a Point

In this one, someone narrates the story while the guests keep track of their points. Provide small scraps of paper and pen so everyone can keep track of their points throughout the story.

I wonder who came here from afar,
give yourself 5 if you came by car.
Were you on time? Not one minute late?
Punctuality pays so give yourself 8.
Now since you're all fashionable girls, give yourself 5 if you have any pearls
You may add 3 if your toes peek out, And earrings will give you 2 more to shout.

A watch is 6 and each ring is 2,
4 more points if your eyes are blue.
Score yourself 5 if you show any pink.
But take away 10 if you left dishes in the sink.

Count all of your buttons... each gives you 1.
Except if they are white and then you'll get none.
For each bow that you have add on 2.
But safety pins are taboo, so for each one
you're wearing you must subtract 2.
Give yourself 6 if your pants are tight. Add 1 for a scarf which is just about right.
Add 5 more if your shoes are black, and take away 3 for a zipper in back.

If you've kissed your boyfriend or husband today,
add 10, but if you've kissed both, you're in trouble
and trouble plenty – now you have to subtract 20.
1 point for each year that you have been wed,
but take away 5 if you have on red.

Pets are sweet, we all agree, so for each add 3.
But when adding it up, kids count for more,
so for each child give yourself 4.
This game is done so total your score -- unless
you have brought a friend, than give yourself 15 more!

Each person receives several counters (toothpicks, pennies, etc.)

Then take turns around the circle. Each person tells of something they have never done (example: I have never broken a bone or I have never traveled out of the country). Anyone who has done this must give the speaker one of their toothpicks or pennies. After going around the circle several times, the person with the most tokens wins.

'POINTS' ICEBREAKER GAME

This is a fun game. Each guest gets points based on answers to the following questions. As guests respond to the questions, they are telling things about themselves. The guests add up their points and the guest with the most point's wins.

Child = 1point

Mingling Games

AUTOGRAPHS

Give all guests a paper and pencil. Tell them they have one minute to collect as many signatures as they can. The person with the most signatures wins.

Barnyard Bingo

Here's how you play Barnyard Bingo: You have everyone pick their favorite barnyard animal. No cats or dogs. Then you have them pick 10 numbers one through fifty depending on the size of the group you may want to alternate the number. You go around the room and ask everyone to make the sound of their animal. Call out numbers randomly and if they have them written down on their piece of paper they have to make the sound of their animal. When you start calling out the numbers the one with all the numbers crossed off yells BINGO and must do a dance by standing up and twirling around making the sound of her animal.

The Seat Game

Ask the following statements to each guest. When a person can answer YES to a question, that person moves to the next seat on their right. The first person back to their original seat wins. There will be several sitting on laps...even 4 at a time.

Steal My Heart

This is a fun game to play when your guests have been seated for a period of time. This is also a great game because it gives your guests a reason to look around to see who else is at the party and keeps them socializing. The rules are simple and fun... don't cross your legs or you will have your heart stolen by the first person who notices! Once your heart has been stolen (your name tag) you're out of the game. Those stealing the other person's heart must stick or pin the stolen heart to their clothing. The person who has the most hearts at the end of the party wins. Award either TupperBucks or a game prize.

Sticker Stalker

When guests begin to arrive at your house, give each guest a pack/sheet of 10 stickers. The object of this game is to get rid of all your stickers by sticking them on the other guests (One sticker per guest). However, if the guest you are "stickering" catches you, he/she gets to stick

one of his/her stickers on you. If you are "caught", you must temporarily take your sticker back, and you can try to sticker that same person later (at your own risk). But if someone falsely accuses you of "stickering" him/her, then you can automatically put one of your stickers on that person. The first one to get rid of all 10 of their original stickers is the winner!

String Toss

You will need a ball of string for this game. This is a great icebreaker. Everyone sits in a circle. One person starts by holding the end of the string and introduces themselves, then you ask them 1 or 2 questions about them. Then that person tosses the ball of yard to someone else in the circle, and you do the same to each person until everyone has introduced themselves. Ask question like: What is your favorite color, music group, the person that invited you, what are you afraid of, your favorite food, time of year, or any other question that you can think of.

Bean Quiz

Object:

Trick someone into answering YES or NO.

As each guest arrives, they are given 10 beans and a small paper with printed instructions. If you are caught, you must surrender one of your beans to the person who tripped you up. The person with the most beans wins. May be played as an opener, or may continue through the whole event.

Variation:

Instead of beans, other objects may be selected to match the theme of the gathering, such as hearts, bells, etc.

BLACK OR RED

All you need is a deck of cards and 2 or 3 gifts. They can be anything small, wrapped pretty, you can even but in a roll or toilet paper, or a potato make sure this one looks the prettiest. Put the gifts on a table or floor. Start by asking the first person if the card you are holding is either red or black. If they guess wrong you go on to the next person, if they guess right they get to pick a gift. Either from the table or can steal it from someone that has a gift already. You keep going around the room till all the cards are gone. Who ever is left holding the gifts when the cards are gone, gets to keep the gifts. This is a fun game and will bring out the sneaky one who will try to hide a gift when they get it. If you use the toilet paper and its the nicest looking they will be fighting over it and when they open it they will be rolling on the floor.

Bows

A very simple but fun game which encourages mingling.

Give everyone a stick-on bow as they come into the party.

Tell everyone that if they hear someone say the word (e.g. 'no') they can take that person's bow.

This goes on during the whole party.

The person with the most bows wins.

You Must Have Been a Beautiful Baby

The customers bring a photo of themselves as an infant or young child.

Put up each photo with a number above it on a bulletin board. Take care not to damage the photo. Give everyone a piece of paper with as many numbers as there are pictures.

Customers try to guess which photo corresponds to each guest. The winner will be the one

who has matched the most pictures with the right people at the workshop wins.

All of the customers will need to be told ahead of time to bring a picture. This is best played when everyone is wearing a name tag.

The Clothespin Game

As each guest arrives, hand him or her a clothespin. Tell them to attach it to themselves in an obvious spot, and each time they "catch" another guest crossing or uncrossing their legs through out the evening, they can "steal" that guest's clothespin(s). This definitely keeps the party from getting too "formal". Whoever has collected the most clothespins at the end of your presentation gets a gift!

GET TO KNOW YOU BINGO

Get-to-know-you-bingo is a simple opener game excellent for large groups of like 30 or so. Create a bingo card by making a 5x5 grid with each square grid being about 1.5 inches square. In each box put questions like the ones that follow and a blank line for an answer. Leave the middle square free. It is good to use several versions of the card (i.e. different arrangements of the same or similar questions).

Sample questions or requests.

"Find someone who..."

"Get-Acquainted Bingo!"

First, jot down some interesting facts about each guest attending the party, such as "Susan -just got pregnant" or "Matt - hired by the FBI." Buy enough 5-by-8-inch index cards for each guest. Draw a grid on each card, three squares across by three down. In each square, write a question about one of the other guests, using your list as a guide. For example, if Susan "just got pregnant," you might write, "Who's expecting the stork?" If Matt was "hired by the FBI," you might write, "Who's come to the party undercover?" Distribute the questions throughout the cards so that all players have equal amounts. When guests arrive, hand them a card and a pencil. Tell them to find the answers to the questions on their card by asking the other guests creative questions. When they find a match, have them get an initial from the matching player in the appropriate square. The player who fills the card with initials first wins a prize.

Getting to Know You

Give everyone a question sheet when they arrive.

The sheets contain about 20 questions, such as:

- who has the newest car?
- the most siblings?
- the youngest?
- the oldest?
- married the longest?
- married the least?
- lived at their address the longest?
- the shortest?
- has the most pets?

etc.

It forces everyone to talk to identify the person who is the answer. They write in the name of who they think it is.

At the end the MC reads the questions and asks who thinks they have the right answer? This person stands, identifies the individual who also must stand. The MC then asks if anyone can beat this answer.

The one with the most correct answers gets a prize.

"Family-arity:" A paper game icebreaker for a larger party

Each person gets a piece of paper with the following statements printed on it. The object is to get your paper filled out with autographs of persons who match the list (Leave room on the paper for signatures).

Instructions: Find someone who can sign each space with the requested information.

If your birthday is between January and March, start with number 1;

April - June, number 4;

July - September, number 7;

October - December, number 10.

Participants must get autographs from another person who...

Easter Eggs Game

A great Ice Breaker for your guests at a spring show! Fill plastic eggs with goodies such as candy, little bags items related to your company (like eyelets for scrapbook companies, tea bags for food/cooking, etc), and be sure to include some eggs with slips of paper for items like a Free Product or 5% off your total purchase. Have each person pass the basket around the room. When the basket gets to each person, they introduce themselves and say a little something about their passion for your company's products.

Don't count your chickens before they hatch!

This game is a game to get your guests at your party to book a party with you. Try it you'll like it. First of all you will need one dozen plastic easter eggs in six colors (2 Pink, 2 Blue, 2 Green, 2 Yellow, 2 Purple and 2 orange) or any six colors that you can get your hands on. Place different items in the eggs on paper. (See list below or choose your own) and let each of your guests pick an egg (Remember to tell your host not to pick the certain color egg that you placed "you are going to book a party today because your host is having a party). But don't allow them to open them up until everyone picks theirs. Explain to your guests the rules of the game before you hand out the eggs. let them choose if they want to play or not, but don't forget to tell them about the other things in the eggs. Explain to all that by booking a party that they will earn free gifts and most of all they will be helping their host reach their goal for their party.

These are the things I put in the eggs.

(2 PINK EGGS) YOU ARE GOING TO BOOK A PARTY FOR YOUR HOST TODAY

(2 BLUE EGGS) YOU DON'T HAVE TO PAY ANY SALES TAX ON YOUR ORDER TODAY

(2 GREEN EGGS) SORRY YOU HAVE TO CHOOSE ANOTHER EGG

(2 ORANGE) YOU JUST WON A PRIZE! FREE GADGETS FROM (your Company).

(2 YELLOW EGGS) YOU JUST WON \$1.00 OFF YOUR ORDER TODAY.

(1 PURPLE EGG) YOU JUST WON \$2.00 OOF YOUR ORDER TODAY.

(1 PURPLE EGG) SORRY! THE EGG YOU HAVE CHOSEN HAS GONE ROTTEN. PLEASE PICK ANOTHER.

- May
- November
- October
- September

AIN'T THAT A SHAME

This is a variation to Mary's Black or Red Game. Have three small gift bags, in one put tickets or bucks (what ever you use), in one put a small prize, in the last one put a note that says "AIN'T THAT A SHAME!". Before you start point out where you have placed the bags, tell the guests that they will get to pick out a bag when they guess the correct card color and when all three bags are picked tell them that as they take a bag away from another guest they are to say "AIN'T THAT A SHAME!". Set a three minute timer. When the timer goes off have the three winners look in their bags one at a time.

Auction Game

Introduction- guests, host and self

Give out \$\$ for each of the following (your choice on the amount).

*Attending

*Having a purse

*Bringing a guest

*1st time to a TW show

*Having a Credit Card with them

Start your demo...after awhile stop and ask questions (to make sure people are paying attention)

\$\$ to anyone who can tell me what this is?

\$\$ to the person that know how long I have been in TW?

\$\$ for the first 5 people who can tell me what kind of things can go in this?

\$\$ for the first person to tell me the price of this product?

Ask about 5 questions in the beginning then resume the demo covering the rest of the products.

\$\$ for telling me who started TW?

\$\$ to describe this?

\$\$ to anyone who owns _____?

\$\$ to anyone who owns _____?

Ask another 5 questions, then continue your demo covering the Hostess benefits and Sponcering opportunity. Increase the money slightly.

\$\$ for what the hostess credit \$ is if no one books a show

\$\$ for what the hostess credit \$ is if one books a show

\$\$ for how much a consultant earns from each show

\$\$ for how much it is to start their own TW business?

\$\$ ETC.

Increase the amount for each question asked by the guest about being a consultant.

At the end of the show... tell everyone to count up their Auction bucks and be ready to start bidding... have 3 to 6 items. Start bidding with \$50... And the guests bid on the items they wanted, go back and forth...The more they answer during the demo, the more auction bucks they get.

I allow people to use other auction bucks they get from previous parties.

Back to School

Have guests list as many as they can think of in 1 minute

Ruler, Chalk, Books, Book Bills, New Clothes, Homework, Vacations, Compass, Apple, Teacher, Friends, Classroom (there are more that you can think of-add them to your list)

Can You Guess

Put several small items into a brown paper bag. Blindfold one person and hand them one of the items in the bag. Give them a few seconds to guess what the item is. If they are unsuccessful they are out. The last one wins.

DO YOU HAVE AN ANGEL WITH YOU?

You tell everyone they can use their purse, coat, pockets or anything they have with them (hostess cannot use the house items!). The first person to find an angel wins. By an angel I mean 5 items. One that starts with an A. One that starts with N. One that starts with G, E, and

L. Some example are: address book, aspirin, Advil - necklace, nickel - gum, glasses - envelope, Elder Beerman card - lipstick, letter.

I always tell them it has to be something they are willing to pull out of their purse!!!

"Duck"

I have a game where I tell a story about our books. The guests have a book that they pass around whenever I say "duck" and whoever has the book passes the book to the next person. When I am done with the story whoever has the book gets to keep it.

Door Prize

Make a door prize form and do this at every party after you are done demonstrating the products. Make sure the door prize has a place for their name, full address, phone #, and e-mail address. Ask these 7 questions:

1. Have you ever had a (your Company) Party?
2. Are you looking for extra income?
3. May I contact you about our extra income opportunity?
4. Do you know of an organization that can benefit from a fundraiser?
5. What is your favorite type of (your Company) Party?
6. Would you like FREE gifts or (your Company) for having a few friends over for a demonstration?
7. May I contact you when a new product or catalog is released?

Guess the Number of Hearts

Count out several candy conversation hearts or cinnamon hearts and place them in a mini-rectangular Modular Mate 1 and whoever comes closest to the actual number wins the (your Company) and candy.

Host pass game

Wrap a gift and give it to the hostess to hold, then call out the list. This is a fast game to play and fun.

Pass to the lady that arrived first
Pass to the lady with the most children
Pass to the tallest lady
Pass to the lady that's been married the longest
Pass to the lady with the largest earrings
Pass to the lady with the most grandchildren
Pass to the lady with the most buttons
Pass to the lady that lost the most weight
Pass to the lady with the bluest eyes
Pass to the lady with the most rings
Pass to the lady with the longest hair
Pass to the lady that walked through the door last
Pass to the lady on the right...and she wins!!!

Kiss Me Quick

Hide Hershey Kisses around the room and have your guests race to see who can find the most

kisses. This is a great game to have at an open house.

Memory Game

On a tray, place about 10 to 15 small items (e.g. pencil, watch, comb, shoe lace, spoon, toy car, etc.) and cover with a cloth.

Sit everyone in a circle.

Place the tray in the middle of the circle and remove the cloth for 60 seconds. Everyone has to remember the objects. When the time is up, replace the cloth.

In turn, each person has to name an object on the tray. The first person to fail to name an object, repeat an object or name something not on the tray is out. The tray is then removed and some or all of the objects replaced, and the game re-started with the person following the one who is out. If the game is too easy for the group, add more objects or reduce the time.

Money Wasting Game

Items Needed: Waste Basket
 Lots of Auction Money

Do party as you normally would and give Auction money to guest for attending, being on time, bringing a guest, outside order, guest list, etc. Also give auction money during the party when guest answer questions or give personal experiences about products.

Place the Wastebasket in the center of the room.

While demonstrating products, have guest "throw away" \$1,000 (or one bill) each time they are "guilty" of throwing away money in the ways you describe.

For example: When demonstrating FridgeSmart, ask if anyone has thrown away a rotten cucumber in the last 6 months. Anyone that has puts \$1,000 in your wastebasket.

Mushy broccoli? \$1,000; grapes, tomatoes, \$1,000 each.

Demonstrating Modular Mates, use stale crackers, cereal, bugs in spices, etc.

Guests' will be earning money as well as throwing it away during the entire party. This keeps their attention and they participate more.

After your demonstration, ask your hostess to count the money in the wastebasket. Remind them that it is almost time for the auction. While she is counting tell guest how you made a lot of money in your wastebasket tonight, and they too could make real money in a career with (your Company). Then tell them that to save the money they have been "throwing away", they need to use (your Company) products to keep their food fresher, longer. And the best way to get so much (your Company) is by having a home party and getting it FREE or by becoming a consultant and buying at a 35% discount.

Then find out from host how much auction money is in the wastebasket. Then, MAKE YOUR OFFER...

Anyone that dates a party right now will get the auction money in the wastebasket and if more than one dates, they each will get the amount that is in the wastebasket.

As soon as one gets the money, they all want it and start a dating frenzy!

MYSTERY PACKAGE GAME

Wrap an unusually shaped gift in a pretty package. When all of the guests are seated, and

may be waiting for the last guest to arrive, pass the gift around. Instruct the guests that they may shake the package if they want to. Each guest is to write down what they think is inside. They should be very specific. For example. . If they think it is a candle, they should write the color, shape and size. If you choose an item from the catalog, play to have the guests tell what they have guessed it is after you end your demo. If it is not an item from the catalog, find the winner right away. The guest who guesses nearest to the actual item is the winner.

PASS THE GIFT

You thought all the gifts were meant for you. But I have other items too.

So hold up this gift and look around, and give it to the one with eyes of brown.

You think you are the lucky one, but let us all share in the fun!

Look around with eyes discreet, and give it to the one with the smallest feet.

Your feet are tiny and very small. Now hand it to someone very tall.

Please, take your time and don't be hurried. Give it to the one who is longest married.

You must be proud of your married life, now pass this on to the newest wife.

Of this parcel you are bereft, give it to the one on your left.

The largest earring I'm looking for now, if you're wearing them, step up with a bow.

Now to the person with buttons-- big or small, any kind, the most you can find gets the gift at this time.

Now don't get cross and please don't fight, but pass it to the lady third on the right.

We should stop now, don't you agree? The gift is yours to open and see.

Pass the scissors

All players sit in a circle, and one is given a pair of scissors. In turn, the scissors are passed around the circle, from one player to the next. As a player passes the scissors to the next person they say either "CROSSED" or "UNCROSSED", and will be told if they are right or wrong. The object is to try and find out what the rule is. It is interesting at the start if the person knows the rule, and makes a great play of turning the scissors around and opening and closing them. The game continues until all have solved the mystery, or you take pity on the remainder. The rule has nothing to do with the scissors. IT'S WHETHER YOU HAVE YOUR LEGS CROSSED!

Pick or Pass Game

This game is similar to the key chain game. Fix up envelopes and fill them with different prizes. Use 6 that say Congratulations you are having a party. 1 that says \$10 off your order. 1 that says FREE gift. 1 that says win a free grab bag. And 1 that says I will pay your shipping fee.

At the end of the presentation, each guest gets to pick an envelope or to pass. No one can open their envelope until everyone has a chance to pick or pass. The rule is they have to do what the paper inside their envelope says (like the keychain game). *For the grab bag use 4 or 5 of the nicer game bag gifts.*

SAY CHEESE PLEASE

This is a cute game to get everybody smiling. How can you not have a good time when you're smiling? Have each person smile as big and wide as they can. Measure their smiles and record them. The biggest smile wins.

Shopping Spree

Wrap a nice game prize in tissue paper or gift-wrap, securing the edges well with tape. Then wrap the prize several times in newspaper, taking care to tape the edges well.

You will need an old hat, a pair of gloves and one die.

Starting at one end of the room, number the guests with numbers 1-6, starting over at number 1 if you have more than 6 people.

Tell the guests that they are going shopping for the prize. The first person (number 1) starts by rolling the die until she rolls her number, in this case 1. When she rolls a 1, she passes the die to the next person, who immediately starts trying to roll her number, number 2. The first person then puts on the gloves, pulls the hat over her eyes and starts trying to unwrap the game prize.

When number 2 rolls a two, she passes the die to number 3 and she takes the gloves, hat and gift from number 1 and continues to try to unwrap the gift. Whoever unwraps the gift all the way, keeps the gift!

WHAT AM I?

You go through magazines and cut out items like the 7up symbol, cereals, cars and you put them on a recipe card then you hand them out to your first four guests then they give clues as to what they are. Then the first four guests to name them wins!! If there is a tie then you have an extra card and you do a tie breaker between them

Balloon Game:

On your computer, type up things like "receive a free ____, take \$2.00 off your order, receive _____,etc....Make enough for every guest that you know will be attending your next show. Print it out and cut out (small enough, then fold in half and keep aside. Now, take unfilled balloons to your show and before guests arrive, place the little papers inside each one and blow up (doesn't have to be fully blown up to create a large balloon, just enough), and tie a string to it.

As guests arrive, they get a balloon. As you hand it to them, say, "This is yours for the evening. After all, what's a party without balloons and presents. Hang on to it and don't trade it away. You may be holding the special balloon." When you open the show, casually remind them to hang on to their balloons, you will get to them later in the show. For the entire evening the women "owns" the balloon and the gift inside. You will see them shaking the balloon and see the curiosity in her eyes. When doing the door prize slip, at #3 say "Ok ladies you all have your balloons, and by now you have figured out that there is a special gift inside from me! If you decide to book a show this evening the gift is yours, and you may pop your balloon to discover what you have won. Otherwise you must return the balloon to me. If three of you pop your balloon, then the hostess gets to pop hers as well." The wording here is key! There is not a person in that room who is not dying to know what her prize is... and not a single one who is thrilled to give you HER balloon back. And your hostess will also want to pop hers to see what HER MYSTERY prize is, so she will work to get other to pop theirs. Have them bring their balloon to you with their order and pop the balloon with you.

Pass the Parcel

Wrap a bar of chocolate (or some other gift), in a layer of paper. Now wrap it in another layer and repeat until you have about 10 layers. Finally wrap it in gift paper (so it looks nice). Sit everyone in a circle and play a short snippet of music. When the music stops, the person holding the parcel removes ONE layer of wrapping. Repeat until the last layer of wrapping has been removed. The winner keeps the present.

Memory Game

On a tray, place about 10 small products and cover with a cloth.

Sit everyone in a circle.

Place the tray in the middle of the circle and remove the cloth for 60 seconds. Everyone has to remember the objects. When the time is up, replace the cloth.

In turn, each person has to name an object on the tray. The first person to fail to name an object, repeat an object or name something not on the tray is out. The tray is then removed and some or all of the objects replaced, and the game re-started with the person following the one who is out. If the game is too easy for the group, add more objects or reduce the time.

Keep your pens game

It is a Way to Get your Pens Back.

You number pens with those little round stickers. Have the Person also write that number at the Top of her Order form.

Sporadically through the show, Call a Number - and give a doorprize. It keeps the Guests attention.

Another variation: Put small labels on all your pens with each having a different number. At the beginning of the demonstration, ask each person to write their number on their order form and circle it. At the end of the demonstration collect all the pens and have your hostess pick one.

The matching number wins.

Product Bingo

As you give your presentation, have guests write down some products you talk about on a bingo board. At the end of the presentation, guests who purchase those products get to mark off that square if they ordered it that night or already own it. The person with the most filled in wins!

Icebreaker Game

Let each guest pick out a balloon from a bowl. Then explain, the first person to blow up their balloon, tie it, sit on it & pop it, will win a free gift. This is a great ice breaker for any group, it gets everyone up and laughing.

Replace your Husband GAME

Give guests an index card and tell them to list an item that they would love to get rid of that relates to your company's product lines. Then, have them list five reasons why they would get rid of it.

After everyone is done writing, say, "OK. That scrapbook item that you have written down, I want you to cross it out and replace it with your husband or boyfriend's name." When they say the sentence they must say: I want to replace (name of husband/boyfriend) because he is..... and list their reasons.

It's a hoot of a game and everyone loves it. The one that has the most outlandish answers wins.
